The Prime Minister laid the foundation stone of key road projects that are part of Nagpur - Vijayawada Economic Corridor. The projects include - 108 km long 'four-lane access controlled Greenfield highway from Warangal to Khammam section of NH-163G' and 90 km long 'four-lane access controlled greenfield highway from Khammam to Vijayawada section of NH-163G. These road projects will be developed at a total cost of about Rs 6400 crores. The projects will reduce travel distance between Warangal and Khammam by about 14 km; and between Khammam and Vijayawada by about 27 km. The Prime Minister dedicated to the nation a road project - 'four laning of 59 km long Suryapet to Khammam section of NH-365BB'. Built at a cost of about Rs 2,460 crore, the project is a part of Hyderabad - Visakhapatnam Corridor and is developed under Bharatmala Pariyojana. It will also provide better connectivity to Khammam district and coastal regions of Andhra Pradesh. During the project, the Prime Minister dedicated '37 Kms of Jaklair - Krishna New Railway Line'. Built at a cost of more than Rs 500 crore, the new rail line section brings areas of the backward district of Narayanpet for the first time onto the Railway Map. The Prime Minister also flagged off the inaugural Hyderabad (Kacheguda) - Raichur - Hyderabad (Kacheguda) train service from Krishna

station via video conferencing. The train service will connect Hyderabad, Raichur, Mahabubnagar, and Narayanpet districts in Telangana with Raichur district in Karnataka. The service will provide first-time rail connectivity to several new areas in the backward districts of Mahabubnagar and Narayanpet, benefiting students, daily commuters, labourers, and the local handloom industry in the region.

In line with the Prime Minister's vision of improving logistics efficiency in the country, the foundation stone and dedication to the nation of important oil and gas pipeline projects were done during the programme. The Prime Minister dedicated to the nation 'Hassan-Cherlapalli LPG Pipeline Project'. The 425-kilometer pipeline will be built at a cost of Rs 1940 crore. The pipeline will provide a safe, faster, efficient and environmentally friendly mode of petroleum products in the region. The Prime Minister also inaugurated 'five new buildings of University of Hyderabad' i.e. School of Economics; School of Mathematics & Statistics; School of Management Studies; Lecture Hall Complex - III; and Sarojini Naidu School of Arts & Communication (Annexe). PM announces Turmeric Board, Tribal University for Telangana

Mahabubnagar (Telangana), Oct 1: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday announced that the National Turmeric Board and a Tribal University will be set up in Telangana. He made the announcements after laying foundation stone and dedicating to the nation multiple developmental projects worth more than Rs 13,500 crore in Telangana at an official event held here. Meeting long-pending demand, he announced that National Turmeric Board will be set up in Telangana to professionally focus on the entire value chain of turmeric. "National Turmeric Board will help farmers in the entire supply chain from value addition to infrastructure," he said. He noted that after Covid-19 pandemic awareness about turmeric has increased and turmeric's demand has also gone up across the world. Modi's announcement comes amid the criticism of BJP by Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) for going back on its promise. During 2019 Lok Sabha elections, BJP candidate in Nizamabad constituency D. Arvind had promised to get the Turmeric Board within 5 days of winning the election. Arvind, who had defeated BRS leader and Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao's daughter K. Kavitha in Nizamabad, had made the promise in writing and even signed it with a non-judicial (bond) stamp.

The BRS has stepped up attack on BJP after the Centre categorically told the Parliament in March this year that there is no proposal to establish a Turmeric Board or any other spice-specific Board in the country. In another major announcement, the Prime Minister said a tribal university will be set up in Mulugu. The tribal university will be named after tribal deities Sannakka and Sarakka. He announced that Rs 900 crore will be spent on Sannakka Sarakka Central Tribal University. The tribal university was one of the commitments made to Telangana in Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act 2014. BRS had been targeting BJP for not fulfilling the commitment. Modi, who laid the foundation stone for a couple of road projects as part of Nagpur-Vijayawada economic corridor, said this corridor will promote trade, tourism and industry in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Maharashtra. He said as part of the economic corridor, economic hubs have been identified. These include a special economic zone, five mega food parks, four fishing seafood clusters, three pharma and medical clusters and one textile park. Modi said as a result of this youth in Hanamkonda, Warangal, Mahabubabad and Khammam districts will get huge employment opportunities and help farmers in value addition.

Amid dry spell, AP CM calls for awareness on alternative crops

Sai, Annamayya, Kadapa, Kurnool and Nandyala districts witnessed lower than average rainfall. However, they noted that some districts can withstand the adverse effects of the shortfall as they have other irrigation sources. Out of a total capacity of 1,174.58 thou-

sand million cubic feet (tmc ft) across all major, medium and minor reservoirs in the state, officials said the present water level stood at 507.88 tmc ft.

They observed that enough water has been released in advance to meet the irrigation needs

of the Krishna river delta while those of the Godavari river delta are being met. Further, the officials apprised Reddy that the demand for electricity has shot up by 18 per cent compared to last year due to the dry spell. Despite the adverse power situation, Reddy said the

state government has spent Rs 501 crore in March, Rs 493 crore in April, Rs 430 crore in May, Rs 346 crore in June, Rs 198 crore in July and Rs 966 crore in August to procure power at a higher price of Rs 7.52 per unit in order to maintain power supply
