Indian cough syrups, time to make licensing & regulation more stringent than ever

Ahmedabad, Towards the end of last month, it was widely reported how the WHO had raised a "product alert" on cough syrups made in and originating from Punjab, a fact confirmed by the CDSCO. The cough syrups were found to have contained "unacceptable amounts" of toxic diethylene glycol and ethylene glycol. This was reminiscent of a similar incident last year in October when the WHO had issued a medical alert over cough syrups coming from another state in India and potentially responsible for children's deaths in The Gambia, a West African country. Mandating usage of duly-certified isopropyl alcohols or IPA in medicines could be a first step "To repeatedly witness these tragic eventualities on foreign shores on account of frequent

slip-ups through the Indian drug regulatory system is not only embarrassing from the government to and no less a standpoint. If we do not take corrective measures, it can turn out to be immensely damaging for India's pharma export interests. In fact, these unfavourable instances should serve as a timely trigger for the government to step down hard on manufacturers who do not observe the standards for solvents and excipients such as IPA and others, as laid down in the Indian Pharmacopoeia. Admittedly, there has been no reported incident related to IPA as yet. But this doesn't rule out a disaster from venturing in the future, said Vikas Bhiyani, an expert who has closely worked with a state regulatory body. (19-10)





No record in Vadodara of MP man 'declared' Covid-19 dead



VADODARA: The curious case of a man who died due to Covid-19 in Vadodara returning home in MP after two years has taken an interesting turn, with the hospital where he allegedly died claiming that they have no such patient on record.

Kamesh Patidar, a resident in Kadodkalan village in Badnwar taluka of Dhadr district in Madhya Pradesh, had reached the residence of his maternal uncle in Badveli village in the early hours on Saturday. His family members claimed that he had died due to Covid-19 in Vadodara and was also cremated there two years ago. Relatives had claimed that Patidar had tested positive in Badveli and was brought to Vadodara for





Dhraj Hospital where Patidar allegedly took treatment also told the police that there was no such patient in their records. "The name does not figure in our records."



SURAT: Within 10 days of having approached the Ukai dam authorities to release water from the dam to the weir-cum-causeway, the Surat Municipal Corporation (SMC) has made another such request. The quantity and quality of water in the weir-cum-causeway has gone down badly. Officials of SMC's water supply department claimed

days. "But release of water from Ukai dam multiple times indicates challenging times ahead," they said.

Water supply experts claim that in the absence of long-term solutions and growing demand for water, the situation will become further challenging. "If long-term solutions are not planned, the water quality will continue to deteriorate. It is required to seal all the waste water discharges into the river from the upstream, otherwise the growth of water hyacinth and impurities will not stop," said Namrata Jariwala, a researcher from Sardar Vallabhbhai National Institute of Technology (SVIT). She said this issue can be solved with strict and concrete actions against waste water discharges. Meanwhile, a senior official of the hydraulic department claimed, "In the past, to improve water level and quality during the summer, we had to get fresh water from Ukai. This summer, too, we may have to get more water from Ukai if the water quality deteriorates again."
